The next full membership meeting of the Woodmere Neighborhood Association is Thursday, February 13^{th} , and Charles Jinright, our District 9 City Councilman, will be there to meet you, so, make sure you are there to meet him -6:30 PM at the Montgomery Museum of Fine Arts.

For some folks, Councilman Jinright is first known as the CEO of The Jinright Group, an insurance firm that he purchased and reconstructed in 2015 from his dad, its founder. The company specializes in consulting businesses on employee benefits and individual life insurance programs.

Born in Montgomery and educated at Troy University, Jinright grew up with the city and knows it from top to bottom, East to West. He has witnessed, and in many cases assisted with, additions like ASF, MMFA, Eastchase, the Biscuits, Hyundai Manufacturing, and Whitewater Park. He has served our community through the Chamber, Business Council, the Rotary, the YMCA, Metro Planning, and as President of the City Council along with a brief stint as Acting Mayor. There are many good reasons he was honored last year by our City Council for his 28 years of exemplary service.

And he is ours... Jinright knows our neighborhood and how it fits in the scheme of the city. He has been instrumental in securing security cameras at our entry points, in getting our police officers better wages and up-to-date crime fighting equipment. He has worked with the WNA Board to get streets paved, the park upgraded, and speed humps secured. He sees what we see, however, in crime spikes, societal disarray, and Montgomery's shortage of trained law enforcement officers. In District 9, he connects with 21 different neighborhood groups like WNA to make sure he knows our concerns and victories.

So, come to meet "Charlie" on the 13^{th} – and bring your concerns, your questions, your suggestions. He listens... but only if we are there to speak up.

"I want us to reconnect, to be the kind of neighborhood Mr. Rogers taught us to be. I want to know who lives around me, whose dog has escaped, whose kid can be trusted to cut my grass. I want to recognize neighbors...know intruders when I see them. I want to lend a hand when needed and know there are others who will be there for me."

"We should be more than a system of streets; we should be a network of people... maybe a WNA networking day...block parties...a system of exchanges to identify needs and talents through the online newsletter or website."
