Be happy anyway.

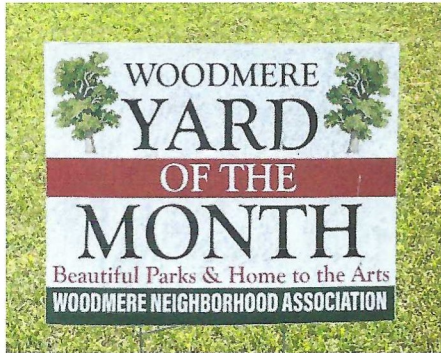
The good you do today, people will often forget tomorrow;
